## Ingredients:


- Boiling water, enough to fill a mug

- 1/4 ounce lemon juice, freshly squeezed
- 2 ounces whiskey (bourbon, rye, Irish or scotch)

## Steps:

Heat the water. Add the hot water, whiskey, lemon juice, and sugar/honey to the mug, and stir until the sugar/honey dissolves. Add the lemon slice for garnish. Enjoy!





<u>Art of the week – Pieter Bruegel the Elder's The Hunters in the Snow completed in 1565 is more complex than it</u>

appears. I wish I could have a bigger picture and go into more detail but here's some insight.

He was famous for painting the peasant life, yet he would create complex scenes out of ordinary activities. Upon closer inspection, there's so much going on here. Take the hunters in the foreground. Basically empty-handed except for one prize and you can see the rabbit tracks in the snow in front of them, almost mocking them that they couldn't catch them. The dogs even seem down. The geometry of the painting sets up the scene so you are looking down from a mountain, like one of the crows flying overhead. And that's just a few examples. There is so much to explore in this masterpiece. I hope you take the time to check it out on your own. In the meantime, here are a few pictures of it —
